Missing First Gen Students in the COVID Cohort

The Problem: Due to financial hardships tens of thousands of First-Gen Low-Income high-school graduates will defer their college enrollment dreams. This will lead to:

- 1) COVID Learning Loss
- 2) Persistence Challenges
 - a. Students Developing Purpose for Themselves
- 3) Difficult Learning Environments at Home
- 4) Soft Skills Gap (common to first gen students, made worse by COVID)
- We can't replicate the work of the many excellent organizations that provide mentoring to encourage college goal-setting and enrollment, or the many colleges that provide retention support to their own students. **BUT**....

Our Advantage: Many members of our organization will be college faculty with the experience to provide *educational skills enhancement* alongside encouragement to persist.

The Plan for the Organization in the Coming Months:

- 1) Start a Listening Tour, Defining the Needs and Solutions
- 2) Develop a Skills Meta-Curriculum
- 3) Develop Necessary Organizational Structure/Partnerships With Specialists
- 4) Recruit Faculty with Disciplinary Expertise (>50)
- 5) Identify Willing H.S. Graduates (18+)
 - a. Pitch to Parents
 - b. Pitch to Students (deliverable project, admissions advice, rec letter)
 - c. Could we work with college students learning remotely? H.S sophomores or juniors?
- 6) Work Remotely With Students Until 2022 Enrollments

Recorded Videos (Asynchronous, spur reflection on the texts)
Bi-Weekly Sessions (Oxford tutorial-style, working through written args)
Soft Skills Tutoring
